PASS Results

66 responses

Where to add 20 minutes:

- Over 60% of tier 2-3 schools prefer beginning of the day
- Over 60% of tier 1 schools prefer end of the day
- 49% of school leaders prefer end of day; 32% beginning of day; 18% split

Early Release (ER)/Late Arrival (LA)?

- Middle Schools prefer LA; High Schools tied; all other groups strongly preferred ER
- 66% of school leaders prefer ER

Day of the Week?

- 44% preferred Wed.
- 23% preferred Fri

68% prefer a 2 tier system, but 62.6% do **not** want to increase walking distances

SEA Results

According to J. Donaghy

Where to add 20 minutes:

High Schools (All Tier 2)

- 60% add at the beginning
- 20% split between beginning and end
- 20% add at the end of the day

Middle School (all but 1 Tier 2)

- 60% add at the beginning
- 30% split between beginning and end
- 10% add at the end of the day

Elementary School (Mostly Tier 1)

- 18% add at the beginning
- 30% split between beginning and end
- 52% add at the end of the day

ER/LA

- ER “is strongest preference”

Day of week

- Wed. “the strongest”
- Fri. received most 1st place and most last place votes

FAMILY Results

11,108 responses
 3,035 were non-white respondents

Tier 1 families (5683)

- 86.5% add time to the end of the day
- 8.2% split the time
- 5.3% of Tier 1 families said add to the beginning of the day

Tier 2 and 3 schools (5209)

- 47.8% (2488) of Tier 2 and 3 families prefer adding time to the beginning of the day.
- 24% Tier 2/3 families prefer adding time to the end of the day
- 28.4% Tier 2/3 families prefer splitting the time

ER/ LA

- 68% ER
 - For all non-white respondents-over 65% prefer ER
- 31% LA

Day of week

- 62% Friday (this aligns with non-white respondents)
- 20% Wednesday

62% prefer a 2 tier system (similar results non-white respondents), but 46% do **not** want to increase walking distances (similar results for non-white respondents)
